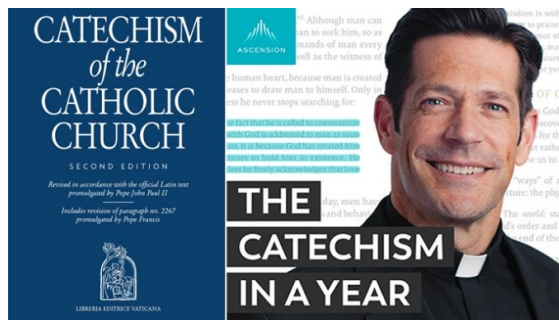
Previous message:
